



Prof Olusoga A. Sofola

Professor Sofola is Emeritus Professor of Physiology at the College of Medicine of the University of Lagos, Nigeria. He has a BSc in Physiology in 1969 and MB.BS from the University of Lagos in 1972. He obtained a PhD in Cardiovascular Physiology in the University of Leeds in 1978, where he was a Commonwealth Scholar. He has lectured in the United Arab Emirates and was also British Heart Foundation Fellow at the University of Leeds from 1998 to 2000. He has been Provost (Dean) of the College of Medicine in Lagos as well as Deputy Vice Chancellor (Academic and Research) and was also Acting Vice Chancellor at Olabisi Onabanjo University in Ogun State, Nigeria. He has been teaching and researching in physiology and cardiovascular medicine, since 1973, supervising several MSc and PhD projects. He also has interest in Medical Education, particularly curriculum development and assessment techniques. His major research is on mechanisms of salt induced hypertension in animal and human studies, currently looking at the role of β -ENaC genetic polymorphisms in hypertension. He is currently the President of the African Association of Physiological Sciences (AAPS) and Council member of the International Union of Physiological Sciences (IUPS). He is Fellow of the Nigerian Academy of Science (FAS) as well as Fellow, Physiological Society of Nigeria (FPSN) and Fellow Physiological Society of UK (F Physoc UK).
